

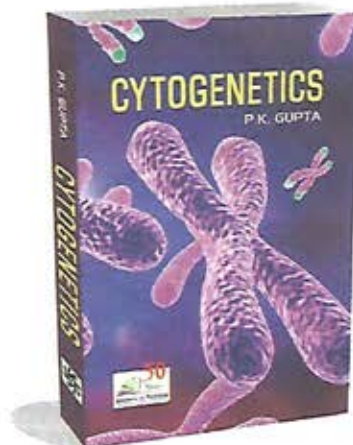

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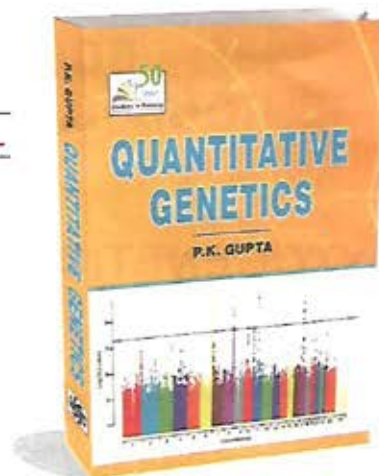

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ABOUT THE BOOK

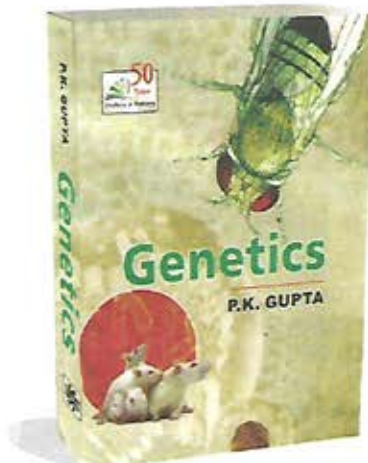
The present book "Quantitative Genetics" has been written to cater to the need of a textbook for a course in quantitative genetics (QG), which is taught at the post-graduate level in the subject of 'Genetics and Plant Breeding'. particularly in agricultural universities. The book will also prove useful for Ph.D. students conducting research in the field of quantitative genetics, since major part of the book deals with the methods for the study of genetics of quantitative traits. The methods of quantitative genetics covered in this book include not only those for plant systems including crop and tree species, but also those for livestock and other domesticated animals (taught in animal sciences). Methods used for the study of the genetics of quantitative traits in humans are also covered for the benefit of the students in medical colleges and those studying human genetics in traditional universities.

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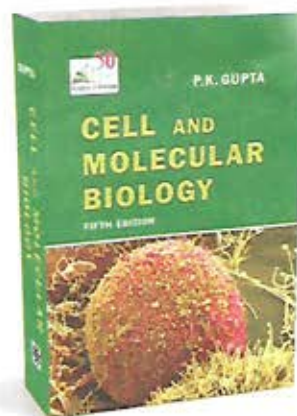
